## PARLIAMENT REDUCES DAHE'S MANDATE

Purikali - Yesterday the Parliament (Haimauman) approved the bill to reduce the mandate of the Prime Minister and her State Ministers to four years instead of the 6-year mandate established since 1977 in the Constitution. The score of 52 favourable and 43 contrary to the act gave the necessary majority for the final approval. The measure will be applied to the current government team. It is a big defeat to the Haima Party, the party of Prime Minister Samira Dahe.

According to analysts, this result is the consequence of the drop in Mrs. Dahe's popularity after the terrorist attack to the Market Street in Purikali

in December of the last year. On that occasion, an explosion attributed to an obscure Islamic group called "Allah ni Kisahe" killed 33 people. The police arrested 8 suspects of the crime. Its connection with international terrorist groups is not yet attested.

## ROYAL ARMY WITHDRAWS TROOPS FROM EAST TIMOR

**Dili** – The Royal Army started to remove part of its contingent from East Timor after four years serving together with UN forces to ensure a peaceful transition to independence. From the original force of 500 soldiers, only 200 will remain in Dili. "Our mission in this country is nearly accomplished" said Lieutenant Colonel Muhammad Agahi, commander of Kaupelanese force in Timor. Yesterday, a C-130 of the Royal Air Force arrived to Tanu Rungu Air Base, Purikali, bringing home the first group of soldiers from the 28<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion of Rataanga.

## WATERA IS PLANNING TO INCREASE OFF-ROAD SUV PRODUCTION THIS YEAR

**Purikali** – This year, K.S. Watera is planning to manufacture 10,000 units of Jangal, the recently launched offroad Diesel vehicle. Jangal or "Yahuk Sailyala", or Angawa Transport Vehicle", a project partially sponsored by the Royal Ministry of Defence. The original purpose of the 8seat car was military although its civilian version can be used in a wide range of applications as a sport utility vehicle (SUV). "Jangal's ability to be used in all types of roads and terrains makes it especially suitable for young people looking for adventure.

Its versatility for a large range of civilian applications should be interesting to our neighbour countries", said Yulyaung Daherayen, Marketing & Sales Director.

The total 2004 production from Watera plant in Nusunmai district is expected to be around 100,000 cars, mostly for export. It also includes Jimpy and Brisk, respectively the miniand the mid-size cars of the company. Jangal's price, however, of USD 33,000 (about KAH 83,000) can limit this prospective view.
