The New Kaupelanese Embassy in Saudi Arabia



Riyadh – The new Kaupelanese embassy building in the Middle East has been inaugurated in Saudi Arabia. Foreign Minister Ms. Flowerina Ulwayatu represented His Majesty at the inauguration ceremony yesterday.

King Kira II had planned to be in Riyadh for the ceremony as part of his schedule of visits to other countries, including two FICT members, Harrawi and the Republic of MAS, but was advised not to travel to Middle East due to instability in the region.

Questioned by the Kaupelanese press

about the future of diplomatic relations in the region, Ms. Ulwayatu stated that Kaupelan is considering opening an embassy in Tehran and that there is no possibility of re-establishing diplomatic relations with Israel. She also mentioned her concerns about the instability in Harrawi following the coup d'état and the riots and military intervention on Shaoran island, in the Republic of MAS.

The newly sworn-in Ambassador, Mr. Waduot Tanafari, declared his hope for peace in the region.

Airlines

Flights to the Middle East

Puikali – Since January, Makuwa Kaupelanese Airlines has been operating three flights per week, connecting Purikali to Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, which, together with flights from Emirates (Dubai) and Qatar Airways (Doha), increases the connection between Kaupelan and the Middle East by 50%. A round-trip flight to Riyadh costs KAH 4,800.00 in economy class and KAH 14,500.00 in

business class.

The decision of establishing the flights to Riyadh was taken by MKA executives based on Saudi Arabia's recent economic development and the potential growth in the coming years. In addition, the partnership with Saudia, via Sky Team, will provide additional connections to 176 destinations in Asia, America, Europe and Africa.
